
Testing Information

Schoolwide tests:

NWEA/Map-



- Measure of Academic Progress in reading, math and language
- Taken yearly (some schools do 2-3 of them) for grades K-12 (not all schools give to all grades)
- No accommodations or modifications required

Star Reading-

- Not all schools do this
- Grades 1-8
- No accommodations or modifications required
- Star Early Literacy is for kindergarten (both reading and math)

Star Math-

- Not all schools do this
- Grades 1-8
- No accommodations or modifications required

Dibels (reading only)-

- Not all schools do this
- Grades K-3
- No accommodations or modifications required

National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP)-

- 4th and 8th grade only and it's a random draw by the state- not all schools do this yearly
- Someone comes into the school and gives this assessment
- Accommodations are allowed
- Math and Reading

North Dakota State Assessment-

- Grades 3-8 and 10 (reading and math)
- Grades 4, 8 and 10 (science)
- Modifications are allowed and needs to be marked on the IEP
- Alternate Assessment is also allowed and needs to be marked on the IEP
- Parents can fill out a form to opt their child out of this test

Transition Tests:

ACT-

- Taken during the junior year at each school
- Students can take it before and after at alternate locations at their own expense
- Accommodations are allowed (talk to the school counselor)
- Only required if attending post-secondary (4 year university) or for ND Academic Scholarship

Work Keys-

- Taken during the junior year at each school
- Can be in lieu of ACT for ND Career and Technical Scholarship
- Only required if post-secondary institution requires it
- Accommodations are allowed (talk to the school counselor)

ASVAB-

- Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Test
- Military personnel comes into the school and administers this exam the junior year
- Tests arithmetic reasoning, word knowledge, paragraph comprehension & math knowledge
- Accommodations are allowed (talk to the school counselor)

State Civics Test-

- Students take this their senior year
- IEP students can be exempt

Individual Screening Tools:

BASC- behavior (Bobbie)

Woodcock Johnson Battery C (short version)- reading, writing and/or math (Dawn)

CELF Screener- language (Paula)

CTOPP- dyslexia (Dawn)

TAPS-4- auditory processing screener (Paula)

Special Education Testing: (should be used mainly for qualifying students)

WISC-V -cognitive (Bobbie) ages 6-16

Mullen- developmental for preschool age (Krista)

ABAS- adaptive skills (Bobbie) ages birth-21

CELF- language (Paula) (CELF Preschool and CELF 5 for ages 5-21)

TOLD-P4- language (Paula) ages 4-8

CASL- language (Paula) ages 3-21

Arizona 4- speech (Paula)

Woodcock-Johnson IV Tests of Achievement- reading, writing, math (Dawn) ages 5-21

Small motor/gross motor/sensory testing can be completed by your schools OT or PT
